

"Read Alouds" Promote Comprehension and Vocabulary Development

Read aloud to your child. "Read alouds" support vocabulary growth and encourage the development of listening comprehension skills. Teachers incorporate "read alouds" into lessons to build background knowledge and to help children learn new words. At home, a "read aloud" can focus upon reading for enjoyment, while still helping children grow and learn. As you read, stop every now and then... think aloud about a character's feelings, a predicament, or wonder aloud about the meaning of a word that may be new to your child. Allow a conversation to occur that will help your child reach his/her own conclusions. If you do not have books at home, check out the great variety of books at the Rutland Free Library and/or talk to your child's teacher or ask Mrs. Pepe for help in getting some books.
